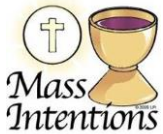

**Saint Columban (Nov. 23)**

Columban lived from the middle of the 6<sup>th</sup> century until 615. Born in Ireland, he was one of the greatest of the Irish monks who carried Celtic Christianity throughout Europe at a time when Paganism threatened to extinguish the faith.

When he was 40, Columban and 12 companions left their monastic school in Ireland for Gaul (now France) to preach the Gospel. Within 10 years, three monastic foundations had been established and the court and the local bishops felt threatened by their power. Columban and those who were Irish were compelled to leave but the monasteries were permitted to carry on. Columban spent the rest of his life in Europe preaching and building new foundations which survived for centuries. Many Irish monks followed his example.

*First Holy Communion*

**Re: York Region Moving to “Red” Zone, Durham, Simcoe and Orangeville moving to Orange Zone as of Monday, November 16 - Covid-19 Related Restrictions**

This afternoon, the Province of Ontario announced that as of Monday, November 16, York Region will be moving to the “Control” stage (Red) of the recently announced Province of Ontario colour coded system (“Keeping Ontario Safe and Open”) to address the spread of Covid-19. Durham, Simcoe and Orangeville will move to the “Restrict” (Orange) stage as of November 16.

**At this time, in York Region,** we ask parishes to proceed as follows:

- Parishes that are responsibly implementing the WorshipSafe measures can continue to operate liturgical celebrations (Mass, Weddings, Funerals, Baptisms, etc.) at 30% capacity. Please ensure strict adherence to sanitization, distancing and other measures as outlined in our protocols.
- Recognizing the significance of the situation in York Region, as of Monday, November 16, no meetings should take place in parish halls or other church spaces at this time. The only exception would be those deemed as essential services i.e. Alcoholics Anonymous/Narcotics Anonymous Meetings. These meetings should be restricted to 10 people and ensure that all appropriate health and safety measures are in place (use of masks, hand sanitizer, physical distancing, etc.). Virtual meetings should replace in-person meetings wherever possible.
- As of November 16 or as soon as possible thereafter, parish offices should move to Phase 2 – Limited Operations – details enclosed.

In Durham, Simcoe and Orangeville, there are no immediate changes required in parish operations. All parishes should be looking at contingency plans should there be a need to reduce church capacity to no more than 50 people (for liturgical celebrations) or if a full lockdown is ordered by the Province of Ontario. With York Region joining Peel and Toronto in the “red” zone, the situation is serious and requires the commitment of every parish to continue to implement our rigorous WorshipSafe procedures. The situation is evolving rapidly and we need to prepare for a variety of potential scenarios moving forward.
