
Next week, we will be holding the second collection in our parish's ShareLife campaign. We ask for your kind generosity and support once again.

Saint of the Week

Saint Adalbert (April 23)



Born in Bohemia (Czech Republic) around 956, Adalbert was consecrated bishop of Prague in 983. The task proved too onerous because of fierce political opposition, and he withdrew to a Benedictine

abbey in Rome. He engaged in several very successful preaching missions in Poland, Prussia, Hungary and Russia. Dubbed the Apostle of the Slavs, he was martyred near Gdansk on this date in 997.
