Dear parishioners, this is my first Easter with you! I hope it will be one of many more to come! Easter is a time when we celebrate the fulfillment of the promise made to the Virgin Mary and to us when Jesus was born 2023 years ago. Then it was said: "<u>Do not be afraid</u>, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. [God saves] He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his Kingdom there will have no end." (Lk. 1:30-33) Today it is said to us: "But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been

raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you."" (Mt. 28:5-7).

Today we are all afraid and worry of many things, may we find comfort in these words which tells us that God is faithful! His promises are trustworthy; **He delivers!** We can see that He not just stays with his people, but **He precedes them**. Jesus precedes us in the times of sufferings, precariousness or uncertainties. 
Regional Mass of Welcome

Saint of the Week





seventh-century pope, Martin was born in Todi, Italy. With many contacts between the Roman Church and the Eastern Empire in his era, Martin was appointed as the papal legate in Constantinople before succeeding Theodore I as pope in 649.

At the Lateran Council, Martin opposed the Monothelite heresy, which held that Christ had only one will, the divine will, and not a human will as well, and not a human will as well. Since Emperor Constans II favoured the heresy, Martin was exiled to Constantinople, where he was stripped of his honours and condemned to death. He later died in misery and hunger in the Crimea, the last pope to be martyred.
