


WORLD THIS weekend, there will be second MISSION collection for World Mission Sunday. SUNDAY This is a worldwide collection for the

Saint of the Week

Saint John Paul II - October 22: Karol Jozef Wojtyla, known as John Paul II, was born in Poland in 1920. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1946 and appointed Titular bishop of Ombi and auxiliary of Krakow in 1958 by Pope Pius XII. In 1964, he was appointed Archbishop of Krakow by Pope Paul IV, who made him cardinal in 1967.

After the death if Pope John Paul I in 1878, he was elected Pope at the Conclave on October 16, 1978, and he took the name of John Paul II.

John Paul's pontificate, one of the longest in the history of the Church, lasted nearly 27 years. He died on April 2, 2005. John Paul II was canonized on April 27, 2014. Saint John Paul II is the patron saint of World Youth Day.
