Saint of the Week

Saint Peter Canisius (Dec. 21)

Peter was born in Nijmegen, The Netherlands, in 1521, He joined the Jesuits and worked in Germany, Austria, Bohemia and



Switzerland as a leader of the Counter-Reformation. Peter educated Catholics with his popular and influential catechism. Although he worked in a time of conflict with growing Lutheranism, he remained moderate and courteous. Peter died in Fribourg in 1597. He was canonized and declared Doctor of the Church in 1925.
