



The Epiphany of the Lord



Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Epiphany. "The Lord and ruler is coming; kingship is his, and government and power." With these words the Church proclaims that today's feast brings to a perfect fulfillment all the purposes of Advent. Epiphany, therefore, marks the liturgical peak of the Advent-Christmas season.

Baptism of the Lord



was celebrated on Epiphany, which commemorated the coming of the magi, The Baptism of Christ, and the wedding at Cana. Over time, the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord came to be celebrated as a separate feast from the Epiphany.

The Baptism of the Lord is observed as a distinct feast in the Roman Catholic Church and in churches of the Anglican Communion.

In most parts of the Roman Catholic Church, the feast is observed on the first Sunday after Epiphany.

In the Roman Catholic Church, the day after the Baptism of the Lord marks the start of the first period of ordinary time.



All married couples will have an opportunity to renew their marriage commitment.

All are welcome to attend. Couples celebrating a 25th, 40th, 50th, 60th or 60+ anniversary in 2024 may register for reserved seating. Reserved seating is limited, so please register early. <u>Archdiocese of Toronto to fund eight</u> <u>reconciliation projects</u>

The Archdiocese of Toronto is allotting more than \$2.7 million to fund eight projects to support the ongoing journey of healing and reconciliation with Canada's First Nations, Inuit and Metis people.

This \$2.7 million represents 45 per cent of the archdiocese's \$6-million commitment, which it made in February 2022, towards the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund (IRF) established by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) in September 2021.

Archbishop Francis Leo said the archdiocese is answering Pope Francis' call to action during his 2022 reconciliatory sojourn to Canada.

Saint Andre Bessette (January 7):

Known to millions simply as Brother Andre, Alfred Bessette was born in St. Gregoire, Quebec, in 1845. Orphaned at the age of 12, he was unschooled, small and sickly. In 1870, he joined the congregation of Holy Cross. For the next 40 years, he was a porter at the College Notre-Dame in Montreal, where he excelled at hospitality. In the course of his duties, he welcomed the sick and afflicted and prayed with them through the intercession of Saint Joseph. He gained a reputation throughout the city and was credited with extraordinary favours and healings.

Possessed with a deep love for St. Joseph, Brother Andre erected a statue of the saint on the mountain across from the college. Then, assisted by lay friends in 1904, he built a wooden chapel on the mountain. Over the years, the chapel grew into a basilica. Today, Saint Joseph's Oratory welcomes more than two million visitors each year. Its founder lived to be 91, was declared blessed in 1982, and canonized on October 17, 2010. Saint Andre Bessette is the patron of family caregivers in Canada.
