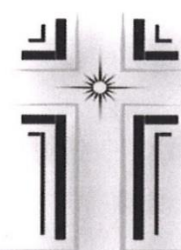

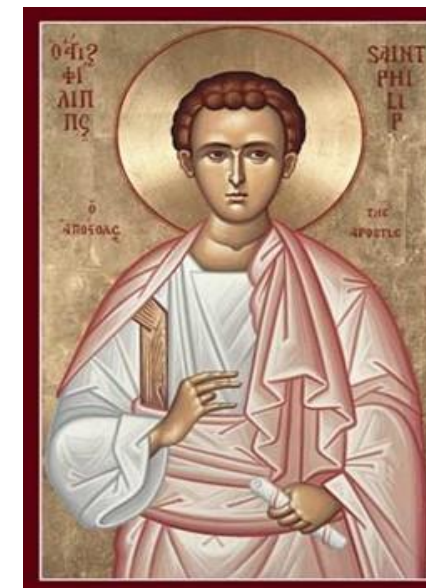

Saints of the Week



St. Martin de Porres (Nov. 3):
Martin de Porres was a Dominican lay brother from 1579 to 1639. He entered the Dominican friary at 15 and serves in many capacities, including as a

barber, infirmarian and farm labourer, and soon became well known for this care of the sick and the poor, and of sick animals. His advice was sought by people in high places and he was well loved and greatly respected by the populace. Today he is a patron saint of barbers, innkeepers, public education, public health, racial harmony and social justice.

St. Charles Borromeo (Nov. 4):

Charles Borromeo lived during the Catholic Reformation. He was born in 1538 into an aristocratic family and, as second son, was expected to serve the Church. When His uncle became Pope Pius IV, Charles, only 22 years old, was created Cardinal Archbishop of Milan and Papal Secretary of State. Charles resided in Milan until his death in 1584. As archbishop, he chose to live an ascetic life and reform his vast diocese, imposing severe discipline on both clergy and laity, thus provoking much opposition. His dedicated life entailed great personal sacrifice. He is a patron of catechists and catechumens.
